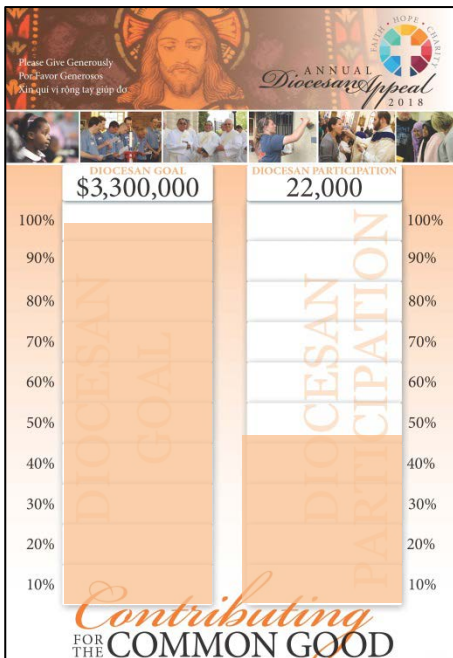


# ERADICATING POVERTY
