

CONGRATULATIONS TO ST. MARK CHURCH

Building a Community to Worship as One



Inspiring. Amazing. Reverent. Those are some of the words parishioners used to describe the recently completed St. Mark Church dedicated by Bishop Michael Olson April 13 in Argyle. The mission-style structure, featuring two bell towers and a dome dedicated to the Holy Spirit, is the faith community's first church building in its almost 30-year history. The entire parish, coming together to achieve a common goal, helped the capital campaign and construction process succeed. Establishing firm roots, St. Mark grew from a mission community with 400 families in the 1990s to 2,700 families today.

Contributions to the St. John Paul II Shepherd's Guild benefit the Seminary Burse, an endowment fund with \$8.3 million in assets. The Seminary Burse annually distributes income to the Diocese of Fort Worth to pay for the expenses of educating seminarians.

Our goal is to add \$1 million to the burse each year with contributions of \$2,500 each from 400 faithful Catholic families. A fully-funded endowment of \$28 million will cover the annual expenses for seminary formation in the diocese.

YOUNG STEWARDSHIP: A WITNESS TO YOUNG PEOPLE

"Jesus' call is urgent. He does not tell people to follow him at some time in the future but here and now — at this moment, in these circumstances. There can be no delay" (SDR, p. 14). This excerpt from the U.S. bishops' pastoral letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response* is particularly powerful. As stewardship leaders, we must constantly ask ourselves these questions: What is our particular moment of life personally and in



our faith community? What circumstances must we take into consideration as we call one another to live and grow as stewards, especially our young people?

In the first chapter of the bishops' letter, they help us to recognize that embracing stewardship is about living out our particular vocations and acting as compelling Christian witnesses to others. We discern Christ's call for us in the context of the community of believers; we respond to the urgent call of Christ. This is why it is very important that we begin forming our children and teens as stewards, so that they will recognize and respond to God's grace in their lives, understand themselves as disciples of Jesus Christ from a very early age, and reflect on their response to Christ's call and their many blessings as good stewards.

There is much evidence that such real-life, day-to-day faith formation is needed if our youth are to remain actively engaged in a life of faith within the faith community as young adults. In the United States over 30 percent of adults under the age of 30 are now unaffiliated. The majority of these young people leave their faith community before age 24. Young adults tell us they are looking for a meaningful way of life; they want to contribute to something that matters; they need to know that religion is not at odds with science, but rather, that faith brings a larger perspective to what is learned through science. They want and need to learn from the witness of adults who are actively living as faith-filled people in the world. Stewardship provides so much that our young people need. Forming young people to live as good stewards is a gift beyond what most of us can ask or imagine.

It only takes three simple steps to make this type of gift. Here's how to name the Catholic Diocese of Fort Worth Advancement Foundation as a beneficiary:

- 1. Contact your retirement plan administrator, insurance company, bank or financial institution for a change-of-beneficiary form.
- 2. Decide what percentage (1 to 100) you would like us to receive and name us, along with the percentage you chose, on the beneficiary form.
- 3. Return the completed form to your plan administrator, insurance company, bank or financial institution.
